## *Family will honor Allens*

Mr. and Mrs. Erwin Allen, longtime residents of Wapello, will be honored at a garden reception scheduled Aug. 9 by their family from 4-7:30 p.m. in observance of their golden wedding anniversary.

Erwin (Win) and Isolene were married Feb. 13, 1931, at American Falls, Idaho, and were sealed together in 1934 at the Logan LDS Temple. They have farmed in the Wapello area for the past 50 years.

The Allens raised four children: Erwin L. Allen, Solana Bench, Calif.; Louis Dean Allen, Las Vegas, Nev.; Darlene Baird, Casper, Wyo.; and Kenneth L. Allen, Blackfoot. A daughter, June Marie, died in January 1945. The couple have 14 grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Win was born Dec. 18, 1904, at Paradise, Utah, and moved with his family to Wapello in 1910. He has been employed by Grimm Growers Seed House, and drove the Wapello school bus for two years during the 10 he worked on the Wapello school board. He worked as school lunch supervisor for the Blackfoot School District from 1954 to 1970.

He has been an active member of the LDS church, holding positions in Sunday school, presidency, ward clerk, scout master and home teacher. Win and Isolene were dance directors for the church's youth group for 10 years.

Isolene was born April 19, 1912, at Dempsey (Lava Hot Springs). She moved with her family to Inkorn that same year and lived in the area until 1929. She was employed by Bingham County Sheriff J. D. Jensen to cook for the prisoners and care for the Jensen family until her marriage. Isolene has made cooking an art. In 1951 she was hired by the Blackfoot School District as a cook for the Wapello School and retired from this position in 1977.

She is an active member of the LDS church and has served in the presidency of the primary, mutual, and relief society. She has held teaching and secretarial positions in most of the church organizations. She is presently serving in the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers organization and is a visiting teacher.
