#### What is an Advocate?

• Someone who pleads the cause of another

#### Christ declares he is our advocate

- D&C 45:3
  - "Listen to him who is the advocate with the Father..."
- D&C 29:5
  - "Lift up your hearts and be glad, for I am in your midst, and am *your* advocate with the Father,..."
- D&C 110:4
  - "I am the first and the last; I am he who liveth, I am he who was slain; I am your advocate with the Father."

## Why do we need an Advocate?

Because we have sinned and are not worthy of Eternal Life

### How does Christ as our advocate differ than other advocates?

- D&C 45:3-5
  - "Listen to him who is the advocate with the Father, who is pleading your cause before him—
  - Saying: Father, behold the sufferings and death of him who did no sin, in whom thou wast well pleased; behold the blood of thy Son which was shed, the blood of him whom thou gavest that thyself might be glorified;

Wherefore, Father, spare these my brethren that believe on my name, that they may come unto me and have everlasting life."

- Christ is pleading our case based on His (Christ's) merits and not on our merits.
  - The condition is not our innocence but rather our belief in Christ and what follows from that belief

• An advocate in a court of law would plead a case based on our merits
