Roberts-Smith-Talmage Dispute

In 1930 B.H. Roberts, then presiding member of the First Council of the Seventy, and Joseph Fielding Smith, then a junior member of the Quorum of the Twelve Apostles held opposing views regarding death occurring on the earth for millions of years prior to the fall of Adam and whether pre-Adamites had lived on the earth. Robert's views were encompassed in a draft of a priesthood study manual entitled "The Truth, the Way, the Life" that was submitted to the First Presidency and Quorum of the Twelve for approval. Smith's views were presented in a speech later published in the Utah Genealogical and Historical Magazine. Roberts and Smith were asked to present to the First Presidency and Quorum of the Twelve their views. The First Presidency subsequently issued a memorandum to the General Authorities (next section). After the memorandum James E Talmage, a member of the Quorum of the twelve gave a speech, with First Presidency permission, in the Tabernacle entitled "The Creation and Man" which promoted views contrary to Smith's. This speech was in a church published pamphlet and later in the Improvement Era. Smith later in 1954, when he was the President of the Quorum of the Twelve published a book entitled "Man, His Origin and Destiny" which gave in depth his views.

First Presidency, Memorandum to General Authorities, April 1931, 6–7.

 "Upon the fundamental doctrines of the Church we are all agreed. Our mission is to bear the message of the restored Gospel to the people of the world. Leave geology, biology, archaeology and anthropology, no one of which has to do with the salvation of the souls of mankind, to scientific research, while we magnify our calling in the realm of the Church.

We can see no advantage to be gained by a continuation of the discussion to which reference is here made, but on the contrary are certain that it would lead to confusion, division and misunderstanding if carried further. Upon one thing we should all be able to agree namely, that presidents Joseph F. Smith, John Winder and Anthon Lund were right when they said: "Adam is the primal parent of our race" ("Memo from the First Presidency to the Council of the Twelve, the First Council of Seventy, and the Presiding Bishopric", 1931-04-05; reprinted in William E. " Here we must have in mind—must know—that only the President of the Church, the Presiding High Priest, is sustained as Prophet, Seer, and Revelator for the Church, and he alone has the right to receive revelations for the Church, either new or amendatory, or to give authoritative interpretations of scriptures that shall be binding on the Church....

When any man, except the President of the Church, undertakes to proclaim one unsettled doctrine, as among two or more doctrines in dispute, as the settled doctrine of the Church, we may know that he is not "moved upon by the Holy Ghost," unless he is acting under the direction and by the authority of the President.

Of these things we may have a confident assurance without chance for doubt or quibbling. " (—J.
