Ward Reorganization

- We view this as a reorganization of the CM Ward
 - Not just fitting in the new members into holes in the structure of the old CM Ward
- We don't' have to make all the changes the first week

 - Needs of the ward are different
 - Domino effect

 - Lists of what we could do
 - Recommendations for callings
- Everything will then fall into place

4 Things we all need to learn about Callings

#1 - It is the Lord's Church

- 5th Article of faith
 - We believe that a man must be called of God, by prophecy, and by the laying on of hands by those who are in authority, to preach the Gospel and administer in the ordinances thereof
- My responsibility as bishop is to find the His will and do it, not do just do what Mike Baird thinks would be cool, or best for me, or even what Mike Baird thinks is right or logical
 - No Find the His will and do it
 - Fortunately Auxiliary and Quorum leaders
 - Prayerfully make recommendations
 - Fortunately Bishopric to counsel with
 - As a bishop I do not go forward without being united with the rest of the bishopric
 - As a bishopric we *only* go forward when we are united that we understand God's will
 - TESTIFY I have seen how the reorganization will work and am at peace in this process
 - Don't know but a few callings yet but it will come together

#2 - "Its not where you serve but how"

J Ruben Clark

"In the service of the Lord, it is not where you serve but how. In The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, one takes the place to which one is duly called, which place one neither seeks nor declines" (Conference Report, Apr. 1951, 154.)

- Terms that do not apply to callings
 - "promoted", "demoted", "fired", "forcibly retired"
- Concepts associated with business organizations
- "Promoted"
 - I was not "promoted"
 - Scoutmaster → High Council
 - Varsity coach → Bishop
 - Trust me it is no promotion to be called as bishop
- "Demoted"
 - First of all to be demoted you would have had to have been promoted
 - I was not "demoted"
 - EQ Counselor → Nursery
 - Bishop → ??
 - No matter how long you have been serving
- "Fired"
 - We do not "fire" people in the church
 - Just because our calling is changed we shouldn't feel fired
 - M. Russel Ballard
 - "Assignments should be made, responsibilities should be delegated, and members should be allowed to fulfill their stewardship as best they can. Counsel, advise, persuade, motivate—but don't do the work for them. Allow others to progress and grow, even if it means sometimes getting less-than-perfect results on the reports." ("O Be Wise," Ensign, Nov. 2006, 17)
 - If you don't receive the same calling in this ward that you had in another
 - That is not a reflection on how you served in the other ward
- "Retired"
 - If you don't receive a calling that is as heavy a load don't feel that you are being "retired" or "calling-challenged"

#3 "Its not about me"

"This is one of the greatest lessons the Savior taught us. Service in his kingdom is not about ourselves but it is about whom we serve. As in all things He is our exemplar in this too. For Him it was not about Him, otherwise his glory would have been that of the world, but instead it was about you and me. All He did was for us. He descended below all, wrought the atonement and brought about the resurrection for you and me and gave glory to the Father." (Private correspondence 2007)

#4 The Lord qualifies those whom He calls

"Now, some of you may be shy by nature or consider yourselves inadequate to respond affirmatively to a calling. Remember that this work is not yours and mine alone. It is the Lord's work, and when we are on the Lord's errand, we are entitled to the Lord's help. Remember that whom the Lord calls, the Lord qualifies" ("Duty Calls," Ensign, May 1996, 43)

TESTIFY about callings

Consistency in doing the basics

- I am concerned that we sometimes feel overwhelmed
- I am concerned that we sometimes feel we are not going to get to live with our Heavenly Father
- I am concerned that we feel that "enduring to the end" means do I have to endure endlessly feeling hopeless or overwhelmed or not happy
- Perhaps we don't feel that way
- In dealing with these feelings I'd feel to address one principle: Consistancy

The Lord would have us be consistent

What do I mean by consistent?

- What do I mean?
 - Too often our efforts are very high which is inevitably followed by too low
- Elder Neal A Maxwell:
 - "Given our weaknesses, however, paced progress is essential, much as God used six measured and orderly creative periods (followed by respite) in preparing man and this earth. There is a difference, therefore, between being steadily and effectively or "anxiously" engaged, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, being frantically engaged one moment and being passive and detached the next." (Notwithstanding My Weakness, pg 3)

In what should we be consistent?

The basics

- Repent
 - Daily
- Scripture study
 - Personal
 - Don't read 100 pages one day and none for weeks
 - Family
 - Parents it may be all you can get for your children
- Prayer
 - Personal
 - Don't pray for 1 hour one day and none for weeks
 - Family
 - Pray for your children that they hear you
- Family Home Evening
- Church attendance
- Temple attendance
 - Regular private worship
 - Regular Ward temple outings
 - Adults
 - Youth
 - 11 times 6-Sat, 5 Wed
 - Most important thing we do
 - Testify & Promise

In the Ward

- Applied this principle to the Ward
- Example
 - Ward Welfare Council determined rather than a single large humanitarian "event" every year
 - big effort
 - No effort the rest of the year
 - Sustained effort
 - Called Shumakers

"You don't have to live a life that's truer than true. You don't have to have an excessive zeal that becomes fanatical and becomes unbalancing. What you have to do is stay in the mainstream of the Church - keeping commandments, paying your tithing, serving in the organizations of the Church, loving the Lord, staying on the straight and narrow path. Bad Hair days happen

- Elder Boyd K Packer:
 - "We live in a day when the adversary stresses on every hand the philosophy of instant gratification. We seem to demand instant everything, including instant solutions to our problems. We are indoctrinated that somehow we should always be instantly emotionally comfortable. When that is not so, some become quite anxious and all too frequently seek relief from counseling, from analysis, and even from medication.
 - It was meant to be that life would be a challenge. To suffer some anxiety, some depression, some disappointment, even some failure is normal. Teach our members that if they have a miserable day once in a while, or several in a row, to stand steady and face them. Things will straighten out. There is great purpose in our struggle in life." (That All May Be Edified, p. 94.)
- Pick ourselves up, Repent if needed, Do our very best the next day
